- All talks must pertain to a project that you are currently enrolled in.
- Music entries must bring the original sheet of music for the judge and have measures numbered.
- Instrumental entries do not have to be memorized.
- Pre-recorded music accompaniment is allowed
- Script required for Readings.

Notes from the Livestock Meeting:

Coffey County 4-H Livestock Project Leaders/Parents/Members Meeting 11 / 2 / 2022

The following is a summary of the actions taken and decisions made during the November 2, 2022 meeting of Coffey County 4-H livestock project members, leaders, parents and Extension agents.

Those in attendance were reminded that there is always a need for livestock project leaders in the county, both club and county-wide. Must commit to holding at least 2 project meetings during the year for recognition.

Members and parents were also encouraged to seriously consider the use of "Z Books" as a tool to prepare their 4-H Record books for this upcoming year. Several advantages and is user friendly.

KSU Junior Producer Days were mentioned for 2023: Jr. Swine Day is March 11; Jr. Meat Goat Day is March 18.

There were no changes made to the springs shows rules or classes. Show committee chair volunteers included: Vickie Wolford – Sheep; Mary Lou Ponder – Goats; Megan Wilson – Bucket Calf; Jeremy Raaf – Beef; Karen Sergeant - Awards. Show date again this year will be the last Saturday in April. There have been requests to have a spring swine show. Curt and Karen Sergeant are working on preliminary arrangements to make that happen this year. Potential date would be the Sunday before Memorial Day but they are looking into that possibility more before actually setting the date.

Coffey County Fairboard is considering initiating a "bedding fee" to be collected anytime the livestock facilities are to be used for events, shows etc to help cover the cost of replacement and maintenance of the cedar fiber bedding in the beef barn. More discussion and details yet to come.

There will be some changes and fairbook wording made to address the county fair weigh-in protocol. Scales will be checked for accuracy prior to each weigh-in. Access to the scale area will be more restricted in the future to eliminate confusion for those recording weights.

The topic of the need for beef cattle "tie out rails" to be installed in the area where stock trailers and pens are now being used during the county fair was introduced. After considerable discussion the consensus of the group was "tie outs" were not needed but containment and safe passage of animals and exhibitors to and from the barns to the overnight area was of more concern. Solution to be tried this year is to limit the space allowed for pens and designate specific club locations throughout the entire areas. The space allotted for each club would be based on the number of beef entries for the club as a percent of the total beef entry numbers for the fair. The club assignment of space would also be on a yearly rotational basis similar to that of the camper spaces assignments. In addition, each night the access road(s) from the beef exhibit barn to the overnight area would be barricaded with public traffic being restricted from 9:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. ONLY beef animals and exhibitors would be allowed to travel the road way during this time to enhance the SAFETY of movement of animals and exhibitors as well as that of the general public. Optional early removal of beef animals between 6:30 and 7:00 p.m. prior to the demolition derby on Saturday night will continue to be allowed with road access to general public being restricted from 6:30 to 7:00 as well.

By consensus of those in attendance, it was decided to remove the requirement for market animals (fairbook rule #9, page 48) that "All species breed "Divisions" will be determined at initial species weigh-ins. Only breeds in which at least 3 separate individuals have pre-entered animals will be designated as a division for entry and awards." For the 2023 Coffey County Fair, any animal breed represented at initial species weigh-in will be recognized in the fairbook and shown in its specific breed class at the county fair.

In addition, it was decided to begin showing heifers by breed and split by age within the breed class rather than just by age as is currently done. No registration papers will be needed for verification of breed. However, breed designation must be done at time of initial beef weigh-in. Therefore, in 2023 ALL BEEF HEIFERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO BE BROUGHT TO INITIAL BEEF WEIGH-IN for verification of breed designation.

Also for the 2023 county fair, it was decided that the top 3 animals in each class should be recognized in all species and that the judges need to designate the top 5 animals overall in both market and breeding divisions. Awards for the "top 5" are to be laminated signs that can be hung above stalls for the public to see.

The final decision made was to change the allowable birth date for meat goats from January 1st to December 1st to give goats a better opportunity to obtain a desirable market weight by county fair time.
