# **ZBOOKS Online 4-H Record Keeping**

Record keeping and Project Reporting are valuable skills taught to members of the Kansas 4-H program. Members are encouraged to keep a permanent record of all 4-H and non-4-H experiences and are encouraged to summarize their project experiences on the Kansas 4-H Project Report Form for project recognition.

To help you through this process, please refer to the Guide to Kansas 4-H Project Recognition. A few items to make note of include:

- Youth may choose to use either record keeping option: a.) the fillable PDF Project report forms or b.) the online ZBOOKS software
- The Permanent Record is included in ZBooks. If you choose to keep records with ZBooks, do not feel like you have to transfer over all of your previous years' activities into the online Permanent Record. Start with this year and attach it to your previous document.

# **Preparing for County and Regional 4-H Day**

- Model Meetings: Must include one of each of the five main categories of motions - Main, subsidiary, incidental, privileged and unclassified.
- Model Meeting is a requirement to become eligible to receive a blue or purple seal
- All talks must pertain to a project that you are currently enrolled in.
- Music entries must bring the original sheet of music for the judge and have measures numbered.
- Instrumental entries do not have to be memorized.
- Pre-recorded music accompaniment is allowed
- Script required for readings

# Important updates to Club Days:

- Project talks will now have two divisions
- ONLY at Club Days and Regionals
  - o Junior, age 7-9
  - o Intermediate, age 10-13
  - Two from each age division will qualify for Regional Club Days
- Readings will now have three divisions
  - o Junior, age 7-9
  - Intermediate, age 10-13
  - o Senior, age 14-18
  - One from each age division will qualify for Regional Club Days
