*******4-H MARKET BEEF TAGGING AND BREEDING BEEF ID DAY******

ALL <u>Market Beef</u> MUST be weighed in and tagged on this day in order to show at the Coffey County Spring Show or County Fair. In addition we will be recording ID numbers for BREEDING BEEF. If your cow or breeding heifer already has an ID tag in an ear that is the number that will be used. If not you will be given a number tag that must be in the animal's ear at County Fair time. Beef weigh-in will take place at the Burlington Vet Clinic from 8:00am to 10:00am, Saturday, March 18th <u>Mark this date on your calendar as it is mandatory in order to exhibit!</u>

BREEDING MUST COME IN TO BE ID'd.

Beginning this year, ALL BEEF HEIFERS will be <u>required to be brought</u> to initial weigh-in for verification of breed designation. Ear tag numbers of cows to be entered in the cow/calf pair class in the Coffey County Fair must be recorded that day but <u>cows</u> do not need to be present at weigh-in.

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REQUIRED FOR STATE LEVEL CONTEST

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a , national, multi-species livestock quality assurance program available for youth, ages 8-21. This annual educational and certification program focuses on food safety, animal well-being, and character awareness for youth producing and/or showing livestock. The species targeted in the training includes swine, beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, goats, market rabbits, and poultry.

Extension specialists and animal industry representatives were involved in designing the program with the intent to provide a national, standardized livestock quality assurance applicable to multiple species. The curriculum is designed to provide different modules annually, so youth will expand their knowledge by covering new topics every year.

There are two options by which a youth may obtain their YQCA certification; they may attend a 1-hour face -to-face training with a certified instructor, or they may complete the age-appropriate online certification course. Both the face-to-face training, and the online certification course have an associated per child "certification fee". The YQCA program has been integrated into the 4HOnline system, so families that may need to will be able to register for a face-to-face training, or complete the online certification, by logging in using their 4HOnline credentials.

Coffey County 4-H members at this time are <u>NOT</u> required to complete such training to participate in a live-stock project at the county level. However, <u>YQCA is a requirement associated with the Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show.</u>

ZBOOKS Online 4-H Record Keeping - https://4h.zsuite.org

- Youth may choose to use either record keeping option: a.) the fillable PDF Project report forms or b.) the online ZBooks software
- The Permanent Record is included in ZBooks. If you choose to keep records with ZBooks, do not feel like you have to transfer over all of your previous years' activities into the online Permanent Record. Start with this year and attach it to your previous document.

COUNTY 4-H CLUB DAY

Coffey County 4-H Day and Model Meeting contest will be February 25th.

- <u>Model Meetings</u> should have an agenda of the meeting for the judge; this includes order of business, old and new business items and the program.
- Public speaking remember the judge needs an outline.
- <u>Interview</u> remember to bring a cover letter and resume.
- <u>Music</u> numbers need to have original copy for the judge (no photocopies) with the measures need to be numbered.
- "Weapons (toys weapon) are not allowed and can't be used for display or demonstration.
- <u>Favorite Foods</u>—you will need to provide one picture of the favorite food you have selected being prepared and one of the finished plated product.

Remember it helps your club when you participate. Each club needs to assign assistants for the Judge of the clubs assigned room that day. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call the Extension Office.
